EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

Early Childhood Screening supports children's readiness for kindergarten and promotes health and development. Screening is a free and simple check that may link families to early learning opportunities and resources such as, Early Childhood Family Education, preschool programs, Early Childhood Special Education, Early Learning Scholarships, home visiting programs and more. Screening is ideally performed closest to age 3.

CHARGER KIDS CLUB: school-age child care

Charger Kids Club (CKC) is our school-age child care program for ages PreK-5th grade. Each year this program continues to grow and increase in enrollment. The hours of operation are before-school from 6-8 am and after-school from 3-6 pm. During non-school days, and during the summer months, the program is open from 6 am-6 pm. Charger Kids Club is located at both Cokato and Dassel Elementaries during the school year. During the summer the program is held at the High School/Middle School campus to take advantage of additional opportunities and amenities such as the pool, playgrounds, gyms, Community Ed. activities as well as air conditioning. As the need for childcare continues to grow in the community, wraparound childcare will be offered to children ages 3-5 for those enrolled in the Play and Learn Preschool program in the .

Charger Kids Club encourages creativity, builds self-esteem, social skills and confidence, teaches cooperation, promotes positive behavior and provides a safe and caring environment for children. YOUTH **ENRICHMENT**

STEM classes provide exciting ways for students to gain technology knowledge and skills while learning to collaborate, plan, design, and problem solve. A variety of STEM courses are offered including:

- COR Robotics Summer Camps
- FIRST Lego League
- Robotics Club
- Scratch Programming

A popular new addition this year was, Art Studio, where students could explore a variety of art mediums each week, including painting, leather work, sculpture, clay modeling, decoupage and more!

For almost 30 years D-C has hosted a week long theater residency with Prairie Fire Children's Theatre. The productions were halted in 2020 and 2021 but, resumed las summer. In late April, Community Ed. was informed that Prairie Fire was closing their doors and unsure when and if they would reopen. So a summer 2023 production did not occur.

Students developed their musical skills through MS jazz band. Baking, cooking and cookie decorating classes are always popular for our young aspiring chefs. Babysitting and safe at home courses were offered to students to be better prepared to stay at home alone as well as watch other children.

AQUATICS

Community Education staffs the High School Pool for a variety of aquatic programs, including: Swimming Lessons, Aquacise (water aerobics), Lap Swim, Open Swim, Competitive Swim Club, Special Events and Private Rentals.

Lifeguards and water safety instructors are certified through the American Red Cross. The majority of staff are current high school students as well as returning college students. To help secure staff Community Education offsets training expenses in return for committing to working for our aquatics team.

Swim Lessons were offered throughout the school year as well as multiple daily and evening sessions during the summer. This summer a partnership with Annandale Community Education was formed to provide swim lesson instruction in our pool to some of their residents.

A D-C satellite location of the High Tides Swim Club of Hutchinson was added this year. Students could swim multiple times a week to expand and maintain their stroke skills while building endurance.

Lap swim was offered multiple times a week throughout the year. Families could swim at Open Swim on Saturdays between Nov.-May.



ADULT ACTIVITIES

A variety of learning opportunities are created for adults which enhance continuing education for all ages and supports a lifetime educational journey.

New and difference classes continued to be offered. While some find success, such as the holiday painting class, "Deck Your Walls" and cookie



decorating, others don't always find their niche. Some new courses that may not have run but were offered included: barn quilt painting, kitchen medicine, basket weaving and board game club. AARP courses, knitting, lap swim, and yoga have consistent participation.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

Dassel-Cokato Adult Basic Education (ABE) is a part of the Glacial Lakes Adult Basic Education Consortium made up of 10 local school districts. Students from Dassel-Cokato attend classes at the Litchfield or Hutchinson sites both online or in person


